

Count all of your letters that are circled. Put the total for each letter in the blanks below.













A stands for **physical touch**. Students whose love language is physical touch like to receive hugs, fist bumps, and high fives.

B stands for **words of affirmation**. Students whose love language is words of affirmation like for others to use words to tell them that they are special and that they do a good job.



C stands for **gifts**. Students with the love language of gifts feel good when someone gives them a special present or surprise.

D stands for **acts of service**. Students whose love language is acts of service likes it when others do nice things for them such as helping with class jobs, helping with school assignments, or helping them fix something.



E stands for **quality time**. Students with the love language of quality time like it when others do things with them like watch a video, listening to a song they like, or playing a game.

How can I show my students these love languages?

Physical Touch:

- ♥ When you greet or say goodbye to these students, use a special handshake, hug, or high five.
- ♥ Let this student hold or cuddle a soft blanket or stuffed animal from time to time.
- ♥ This student may enjoy you lightly scratching their back when you walk by or a pat on the shoulder to encourage them.
- ♥ Give high fives or fist bumps to congratulate them whenever you catch them doing something positive.
- ♥ Occasionally call out for high fives and fist bump celebrations in the classroom.
- ♥ Play games that require hand clapping, spinning, or jumping. Something that requires an action and touching.

Words of Affirmation:

- ♥ Put a post – it note on their desk with encouraging words.
- ♥ Make a habit of mentioning something specific you've observed that highlights your student's accomplishments.
- ♥ Ask what your student wants to do or be when they grow up. Then encourage them in ways that help them pursue these dreams.
- ♥ Take a picture or other creation the student has made and put it on display for others to see. Maybe even share what you like about it.
- ♥ Make a point to let this child know what they mean to you.
- ♥ Create a special name of affection for this student that is only used between you two.
- ♥ When you have to be absent from the classroom, leave this student a message.
- ♥ When this student is feeling down, share five reasons you are proud of them.
- ♥ Create an encouragement jar that you and your students can use to drop in notes of praise and read together on a regular basis.
- ♥ When this student makes a mistake trying to do something helpful, first use words to recognize that you knew of their good intentions.

How can I show my students these love languages?

Quality Time:

- ♥ Instead of waiting until all of the little classroom tasks are done before spending time with your student, include them in your daily activities such as sharpening pencils, changing the date on the board, or organizing papers.
- ♥ Stop what you are doing to make eye contact with your student as they tell you something important.
- ♥ Have lunch together occasionally.
- ♥ Find silly things to laugh about and laugh a lot about them.
- ♥ Allow older students to capture memories and fun activities on camera.
- ♥ Ask very specific questions about your students day and life.
- ♥ When taking students to recess or play time, spend the time actually playing with them instead of watching from a bench.
- ♥ Spend time doing classwork together.
- ♥ Plant something together in a school garden.
- ♥ Take care of a class pet together.
- ♥ Make a class photo album together on the computer. Talk about the memories as you are going through the process.

Gifts:

- ♥ Keep small collection of inexpensive gifts (treasure box items) packed away for your student. Then give them one at a time as you sense there is a need.
- ♥ Keep snacks or small candy in the goodie jar that you can pull out as a treat.
- ♥ Wrap student gifts in fun tissue paper or wrapping paper.
- ♥ When absent from the classroom, leave a little treat with their name on it.
- ♥ Give personally made coupons for this student, good for some of their favorites, such as candy, write with a pen, switch seats with a classmate.
- ♥ Hide a small gift your student's desk.

How can I show my students these love languages?

Acts of Service:

- ♥ Help your student practice their sight words, math facts, or sports skills.
- ♥ Sit down and help your student if they're having computer problems.
- ♥ Instead of just telling your student to get packed up, grab their backpack for them and get their gear together for dismissal.
- ♥ Begin teaching your students the importance of serving others through regular involvement together in a service project.
- ♥ Help these students write their homework in their agenda, or get their supplies out for the day.
- ♥ Connect your student with others who have the same interests or hobbies.
- ♥ Make a list of several of your students favorite things to do with you. Then periodically do one of their favorites when they least expect it.
- ♥ Create flash cards of your students study guide with them to help them study for a test.
- ♥ Assist your student in fixing something that is broken, or finding something that is lost.
