

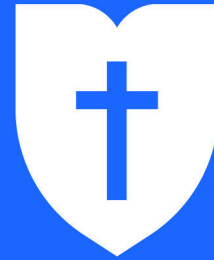

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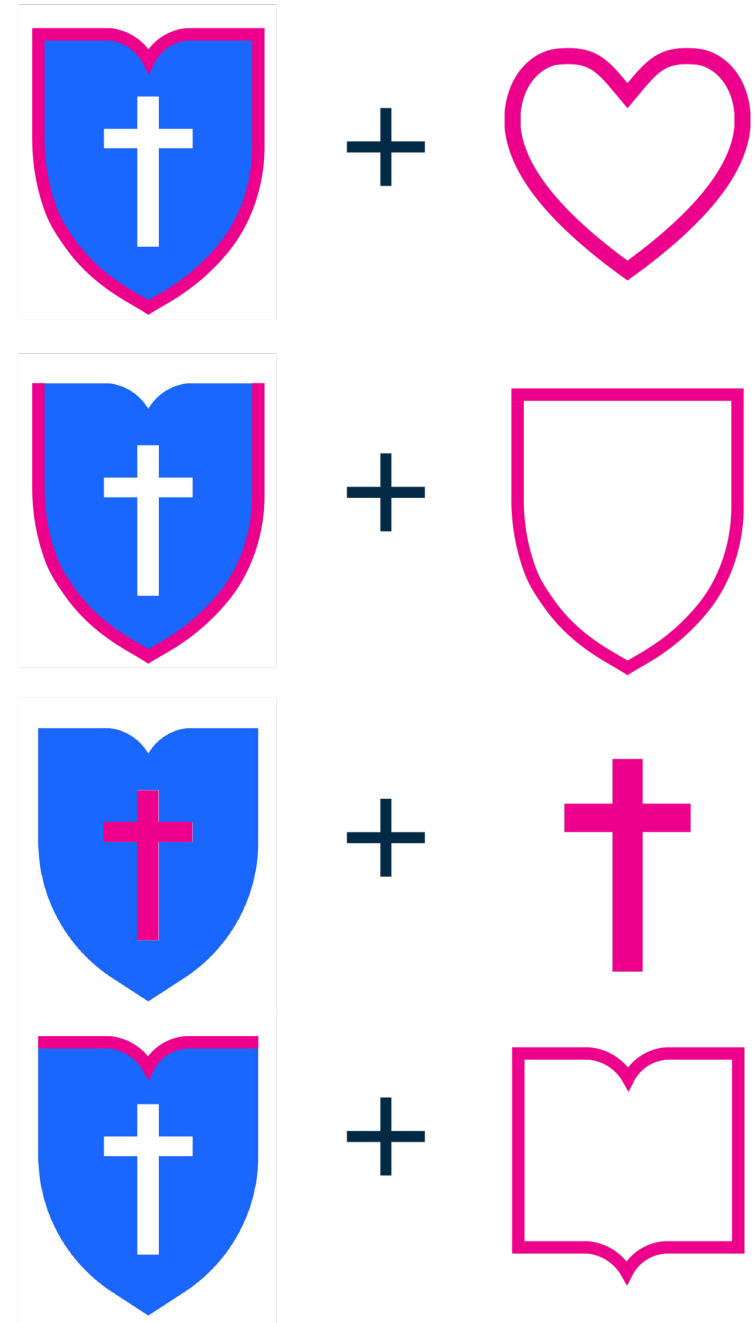
Evolving the Logo

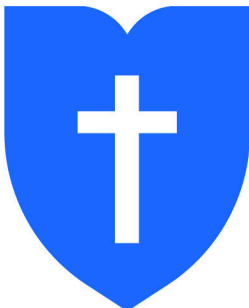
Using the crest to bring uniformity and cohesion allows the schools to be further connected to the SCEA brand.

The subtle nod to the Bible in the crest brings some distinction from other crests, whilst also feeling like an evolution of the current logo.

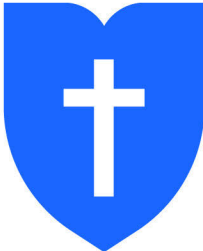
- **Heart = Pastoral**

Colour and imagery/photography in the broader brand will allow the uniqueness of each school to shine whilst also complementing each other.





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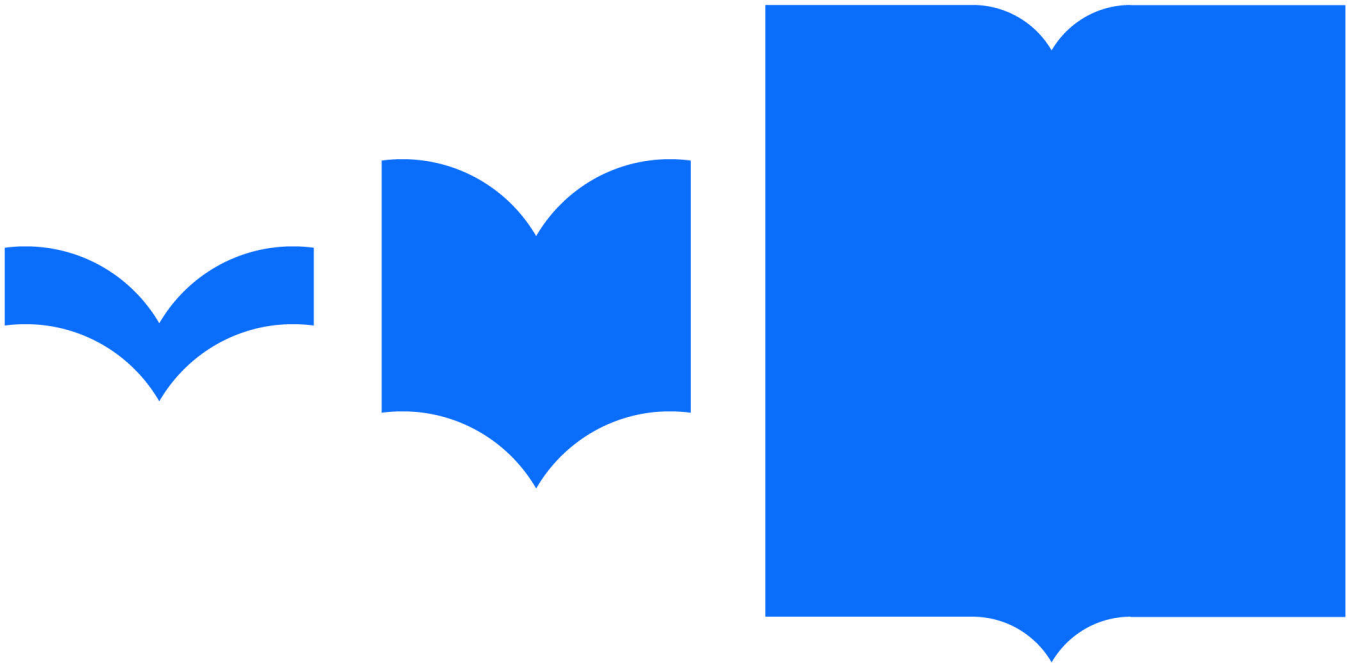


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Brand Elements





Iconography & Illustration Style

Iconography and illustration work together to strengthen the brand, each playing a distinct role.

Iconography is simple, clear and functional. Icons distil ideas into recognisable symbols that work best at small scale. They sit comfortably alongside text, within navigation, diagrams or supporting content, helping communicate meaning quickly and consistently.

Illustration brings depth and personality. Used at larger scale, it can act as a flourish across covers, campaigns or hero moments. Illustration adds emotion and narrative without needing to explain everything in detail. We have shown how to extend the CHARIS virtues into illustrations here, but this style may be applied across a variety of things such as blog tiles, social posts, school houses/factions etc.

Together, icons provide clarity and structure, while illustration adds story and character. Used in balance, they create a brand that feels both cohesive and expressive.

Chief Executive Officer's Report

"How good and pleasant it is when God's people live together in unity!"

When we look back over 2024, we have every reason to be grateful.

God has blessed us beyond measure as an organisation. Like many Christian schools across the country, our schools have continued to grow as families are drawn to the gospel inspired approach to education that we offer - and we have the privilege of watching their sons and daughters learn, grow and encounter Jesus in our classrooms.

During Term 1, when the Board and Senior Leadership Team came together for a retreat, time was spent reflecting on the past and identifying what our strategic priorities should be in the years ahead. Through this process, three priorities were identified - unity, capacity and reach.

'Unity' was identified as an important next step in our corporate journey. In our previous Strategic Plan 2020 - 2025, we had adopted interdependence as a priority, because at the time, it was widely acknowledged that SCEA schools were often operating in isolation and the benefits of being a system of schools were not being fully realised. In recent years, we have made significant progress in this area, and it is now time to take the next step and move from interdependence to unity. Integral to our plans to foster greater unity, is a commitment to embed across all SCEA sites, a shared vision, mission and set of virtues. There is also a deep desire to further expand the opportunities for staff from across our schools to collaborate and learn from each other. We know the more we do this, the more effective we will become.

'Capacity' was found to be important because the substantial growth in enrolments over the past five years placed considerable pressure on many of our systems and processes, creating a need to review and strengthen them to ensure they will serve us well as we continue to grow. This work includes the critical area of recruitment.

Our ability to achieve our God given mission is reliant on our capacity to attract and retain quality staff and in a period where there is a national shortage of teacher - this is a challenge that demands our attention.

"Reach" as a priority recognises our desire to expand our reach into the wider community, and particularly, our ability to serve families whose children have learning difficulties and those from under-represented groups.

We are delighted that preparation of the Strategic Plan 2025-2030 was finalised in 2024, ready for release in Term 1 2025. Based on the feedback we have received in response, there is a high degree of confidence that it will allow us to more effectively achieve our mission, which is to value and empower every student to become all God created them to be.

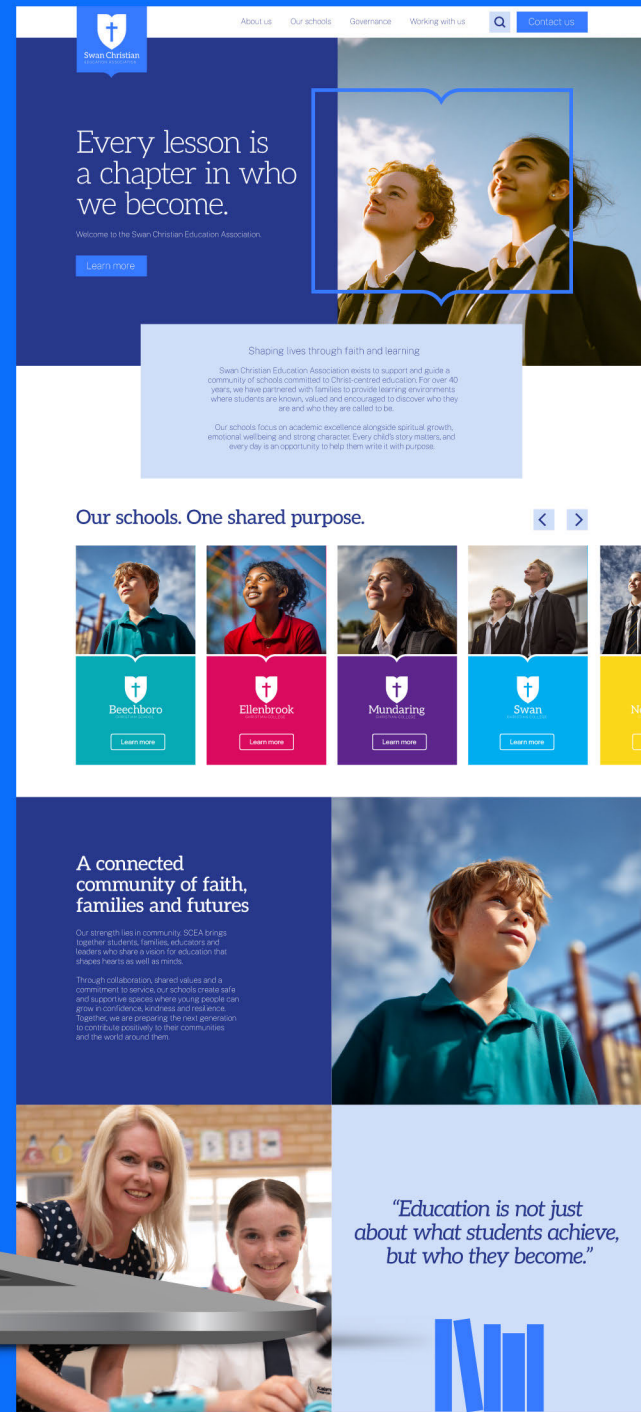
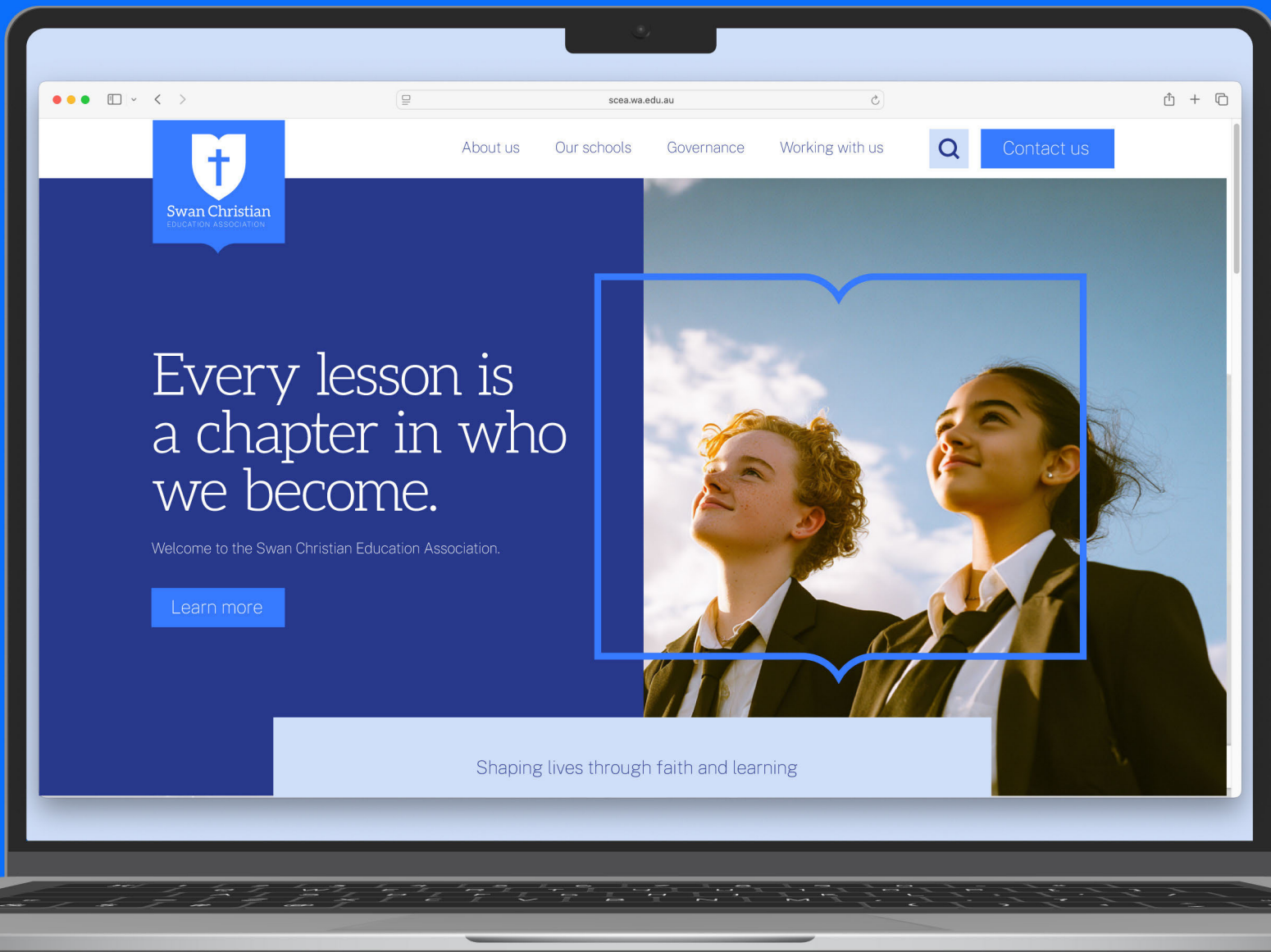
